Chen Guidi and Wu Chuntao, *Will the Boat Sink the Water?* (Public Affairs, 2006). Abridged English translation of a now-banned book of investigative reporting into corruption and police abuse in a Chinese village.

Patricia Ebrey, *Chinese Civilization: A Sourcebook* (Free Press, 1993) – Short excerpts from both the classics and little-known documents, giving the texture of Chinese politics in the past.

Ian Johnson, *Wild Grass: Three Stories of Change in Modern China* (Pantheon, 2004). By the Pulitzer-winning WSJ reporter, charts the challenges of human rights advocacy in China.

Josh Kurlantzick, *Charm Offensive: How China's Soft Power Is Transforming the World*, (Yale University Press, 2007). Kurlantzick is a China hand and longtime Burma-watcher.
